

Engineer of the Year – Dr. Ying-Ming Lee

The Montana Society of Professional Engineers Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers has elected Dr. Ying-Ming Lee as the 2003 Butte Area Engineer of the Year. Dr. Lee is an aerospace engineer with MSE Technology Applications and is responsible for overseeing advanced energy and aerospace projects for NASA.

Dr. Lee is a member of the Space Propulsion Committee for the International Astronautical Federation, which is the international governing body for all national aerospace organizations. He has authored and co-authored more than 30 technical papers, typically for publications and conferences of the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics and equally prestigious professional organizations.

He is a member of Toastmasters International and has achieved Advanced Toastmaster Bronze status, is a member of Silver Bow Kiwanis and received the George Hixson Fellow honor from that organization in October 2003, serves on the Mai Wah Society Board of Directors, supports Montana Tech's "Tech Day", and is a mentor and advisor to foreign students and co-workers.

Dr. Lee holds a B.S. in Aeronautical and Astronautical Engineering from the National Cheng-Kung University in Taiwan, and masters and doctorate degrees in Aerospace Engineering from the University of Texas at Arlington.
